Mr. Pfadenhauer also regularly advises pharmaceutical clients about the provisions of the Hatch-Waxman Act and related patent litigation and has lectured about these topics before industry groups. He also has served as a Master in the Giles S. Rich American Inn of Court.

In addition to his extensive civil litigation experience, Mr. Pfadenhauer has represented corporations and individuals in criminal matters initiated by the Department of Justice, various U.S. Attorney's offices, and Independent Counsel.

Mr. Pfadenhauer joined Williams & Connolly LLP in 1987, and has been a partner since 1996. He currently serves as a member of the firm's Executive Committee and previously served as Chair of the firm's Hiring Committee.
